Specialised Curriculum

All Year 7 students will take part in a carefully crafted curriculum that encompasses traditional academic subjects such as English, Maths and Science taught by our specialist teachers plus a range of cross curricular learning experiences.

The key to success is careful assessment when the children arrive at President Kennedy School which enables us to identify strengths and weaknesses early. We then devise highly personalised timetables for each student based on their particular needs to make sure that every child is stretched to reach their full potential.

Students are quickly placed in sets according to their ability in English and Maths.

Students who arrive below national average in key subjects such as English and Maths are often offered additional lessons such as our Fresh Start & Guided Reading Programme in small groups which give them just the boost they need.

The Bridge boasts an experienced team who are all educational professionals dedicated to the Year 7 students in their care. The Bridge is led by Mrs Alexander-Weller, Director of the Bridge, who has many years experience in school leading and developing Year 7 students. There is also a Bridge Pastoral Leader who specialises in the Pastoral Care of 11-12 year olds.

The Bridge staff are always on hand to answer questions and ensure the students feel secure and happy. The team is greatly enhanced by a full time literacy specialist, Miss Griffin, and several numeracy teachers who assess children's ability, monitor progress and organise additional lessons which increase attainment in these important subjects. There is also a strong team of Bridge teaching assistants who specialise in supporting Year 7s.

Parents and Carers

At every stage of our Transition Programme we go out of our way to meet and engage with prospective parents and carers. This is important to us for two reasons. Firstly, parents and carers are a vital source of information and this input helps us understand the individual needs of children early on. Secondly, parents and carers are an essential part of the process of education. We know that close relationships between parents/carers and our staff greatly enhances the success of your child through their time at President Kennedy School. Year 7 Parents are invited to join a Parental Partnership group to provide us with continual feedback and ideas for improvement. We also offer regular events where parents can join us and learn alongside their child.

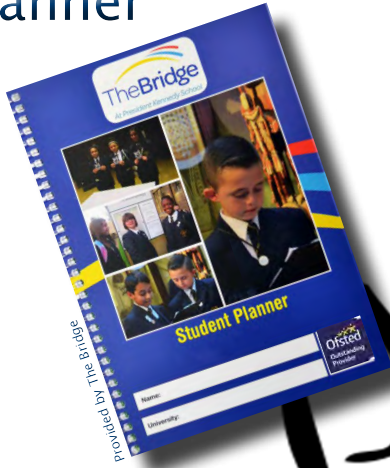

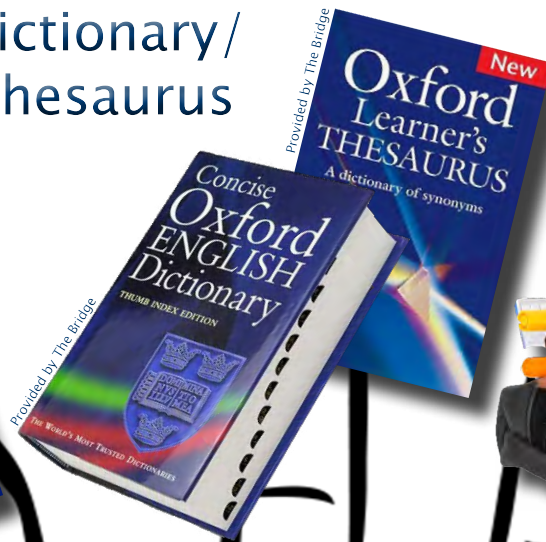

Making the Grade ... At GCSE and A Level



Another set of outstanding GCSE results in 2021, doubling overall academic progress from 2020.

In 2021, President Kennedy School's GCSE results were strong for another year, with 74% of students achieving at least five GCSEs at grade 4+ including English and Maths. Student performance at 7+ was as strong as ever, with 14% of students achieving five or more 7+ grades.

This year's results were partly based on internal teacher assessment of students, demonstrating just how confident teachers were in students' ability as the cohort developed through their five years at the school.

Based on these results, and results from the past four years, students at President Kennedy School typically achieve at least a third of a grade higher across their subjects than would be expected nationally.

The strength of these results means we have welcomed record numbers of students into Post 16 courses this year. The vast majority of our Year 11 students have progressed onto Level 3 courses for this academic year. We are very proud to offer a diverse range of Level 3 courses and be fully inclusive of students of all abilities.



"Students achieve exceptionally well and above national averages by the end of Key Stage 4.

At A Level, across all subjects, 35% of our students achieved the grade of A* or A in the Academic Route and 70% Distinction or Distinction* grades in the Professional Route. The average grade achieved by students studying professional pathway subjects was a Distinction which is an outstanding achievement. An impressive 62% of grades secured by President Kennedy students studying academic A levels at A* to B.

Our A level results are especially pleasing as President Kennedy School is highly inclusive and welcomes a very high proportion of year 11 students to study in Post 16. Given the strength of these results, all our students who applied to join Higher Education courses succeeded in securing an offer, with 97% of them securing their first choice place.



Students who have not chosen to go on to Higher Education have gained places on high quality apprenticeships or positions in employment.

More than 1 in 5 students secured places at top ranking 'Russell Group' universities and 77% of students secured places at 'Top 50' Universities. This year saw our greatest number of students gaining places on medicine and dentistry courses at highly prestigious universities such as Birmingham University and Clare College Cambridge University.

Post 16 Destinations 2021

A very high percentage of our students choose to stay with us and study in Post 16. In 2021 every student who applied to higher education gained a place and the majority of our students secured their first choice place at university. More than 1 in 5 students secured places at top ranking 'Russell Group' universities and 77% of students secured places at 'Top 50' Universities.

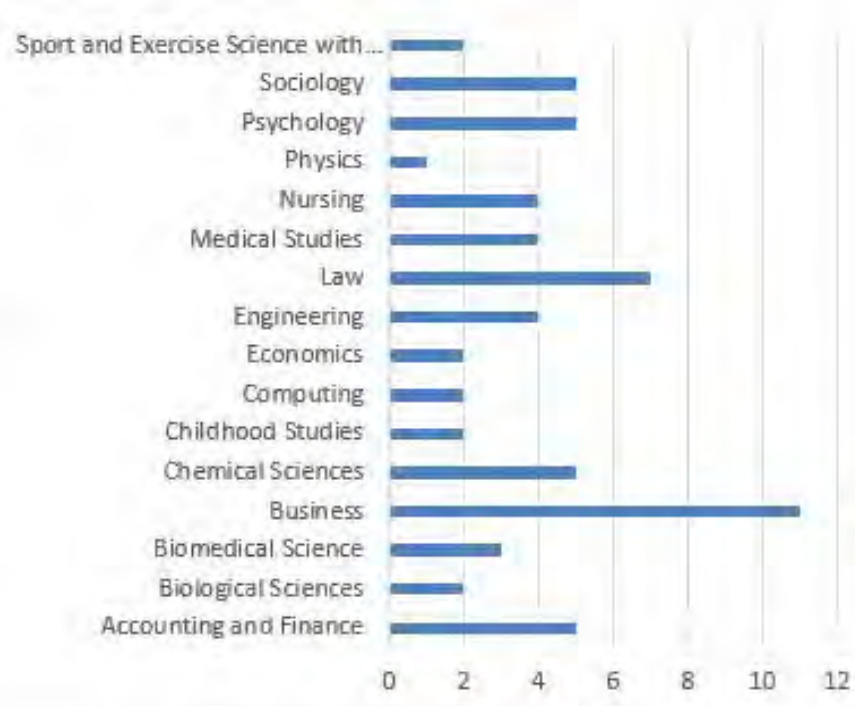
Our students benefit greatly from the advice and guidance of our careers and Post 16 team.

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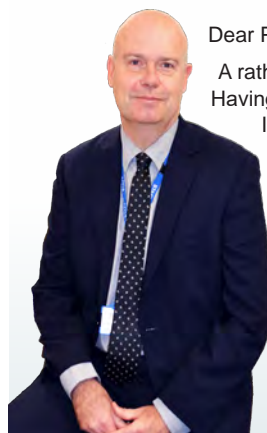

World Class Schools' Symposium 2022 - President Kennedy School Re-awarded World Class Quality Mark accreditation

On 6th July 2022, President Kennedy School was re-awarded World Class Schools Quality Mark re-accreditation at an Awards Ceremony at St Marylebone School, having successfully passed a rigorous student-led assessment process to prove they have consistently maintained a World Class standard of education since their last accreditation assessment two years ago.

The premise is that if our school is truly World Class, then our students should be able to demonstrate this in whatever context they find themselves. 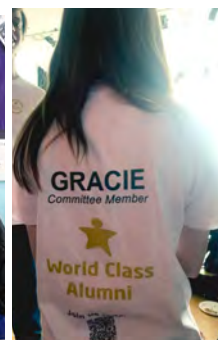

Where the River Runs Gold by Sita Brahmachari

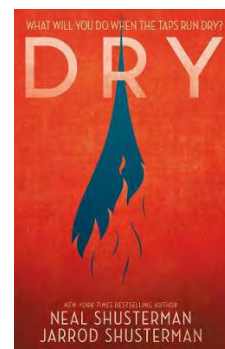
