We are delighted that in July 2013, our school was judged outstanding in all areas by Ofsted, awarded World Class Schools Status in 2017 and re-accredited in 2019 and in 2022.

Specialised Curriculum

All Year 7 students will take part in a carefully crafted curriculum that encompasses traditional academic subjects such as English, Maths and Science taught by our specialist teachers plus a range of cross curricular learning experiences.

The key to success is careful assessment when the children arrive at President Kennedy School which enables us to identify strengths and areas for development early. We then devise highly personalised timetables for each student based on their particular needs to make sure that every child is stretched to reach their full potential.

Students are quickly placed in sets according to their ability in English and Maths in order to maximise their progress.

Students who arrive below national average in key subjects such as English and Maths are often offered additional lessons delivered as our Fresh Start & Guided Reading Programme in small groups which give them just the boost they need in order to make accelerated progress.

The Bridge boasts an experienced team who are all educational professionals dedicated to the Year 7 students in their care. The Bridge is led by Miss Tovey, Director of The Bridge, who has many years experience in school leading and developing Year 7 students. There is also a Bridge Pastoral Leader who specialises in the Pastoral Care of 11-12 year olds.

The Bridge staff are always on hand to answer questions and ensure the students feel secure and happy. The team is greatly enhanced by a full time literacy specialist, Miss Griffin, and several numeracy teachers who assess children's ability, monitor progress and organise additional lessons which increase attainment in these important subjects. There is also a strong team of Bridge teaching assistants who specialise in supporting Year 7s.

Parents and Carers

At every stage of our Transition Programme we go out of our way to meet and engage with prospective parents and carers. This is important to us for two reasons. Firstly, parents and carers are a vital source of information and this input helps us understand the individual needs of children early on. Secondly, parents and carers are an essential part of the process of education. We know that close relationships between parents/carers and our staff greatly enhances the success of your child through their time at President Kennedy School. Year 7 Parents are invited to join a Parental Partnership group to provide us with continual feedback and ideas for improvement. We also offer regular events where parents can join us and learn alongside their child.



Year 7 Curriculum Overview



English	In Year 7 English, you will study a range of texts and genres that will allow you to find and develop your voice. Your studies will span from the origin of stories to how stories are told in the modern day, exploring the forms of plays, novels, poetry and non-fiction. You will be on your own personalised pathway where your teachers will be guiding you to read, write and speak with authority so that you have the tools to thrive at President Kennedy School.
Maths	In Year 7 Mathematics, you will continue your numeracy journey which started in primary school. Your studies will be deepening your knowledge of a range of concepts from number, algebra, geometry, statistics, probability, ratio and proportion and how they entwine with each other. Mathematics is a universal subject and therefore you will continue to develop your ability to think, question and communicate like a mathematician.
Science	Year 7 Science is about discovering the world around you. In Year 7 Science, you'll explore how your body works, from the tiniest cells to the journey of your food through the digestive system. You'll learn how animals and plants are connected through food chains and what makes a balanced diet. In Chemistry, you'll investigate the properties of solids, liquids and gases, explore amazing reactions, and uncover the secrets hidden in rocks. In Physics, you'll dive into the forces that move objects, discover why we have seasons and night and day, explore the power of pressure, and experiment with the invisible pull of magnets. Get ready to ask questions, investigate the world, and think like a scientist!
Geography	In Year 7 Geography, your study will begin with our local area of Coventry to understand a range of geographical concepts including how people live and the reasons our settlement developed. You will continue your learning journey to explore the ways in which you are connected to the rest of the world and the implications of this on people around the world. Throughout this, you will develop the skills to think critically about the world we live in and how you can make a difference.
History	The Year 7 Learning Journey covers 2 key areas of British History. 'Power and the People in the Middle Ages' focusses on the struggle for power and the daily challenges to people's lives. 'The World Turned Upside Down' follows the upheaval of the Tudor and Stuart eras. You will be engaged in tasks which will strengthen your writing and oracy skills, improve your understanding of chronology, learn to question historic sources and develop greater empathy. There is also an induction period which introduces the idea of cultural diversity in Britain.
I.T	In Year 7 IT you will learn all about the incredible world of technology. You will discover how computers work and learn how to ensure you safely engage with technology. You will become competent users of various IT programs applying yourselves to many fun and exciting projects along the way. You will explore concepts of programming creating games, learn how to create vector graphics as well aa managing a project using spreadsheet software.









Spanish	Year 7 Spanish is exciting, fun and full of variety throughout the year. We start Year 7 by concentrating on the phonics and play a wide range of games to ensure everyone is secure in the pronunciation of the language. We then continue with <i>Langlovision</i> , a singing competition in Spanish and start to develop reading and writing skills through song. After Christmas, we continue to learn the language through film and continue to develop our four main skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Our final topic in Year 7 is 'Home' where you are taught how to discuss and write about your home and area. Our experienced staff will ensure you enjoy and excel in Spanish, and we look forward to meeting you all in September.
PE	In Year 7 PE, you will participate in a range of team and individual sports, where you will practice skills, take part in conditioned games and full sided games. You will develop your own personal fitness, begin to understand tactics and rules and understand how best to work as a team. There will also be the opportunity to represent the school in many different sports.
Technology	In year 7 Design and Technology, you will learn a range of different skills that will allow you to develop your creative abilities and deepen your understanding and precision of these, as well as various techniques. We will work on a number of projects exploring your skills in Textiles, Product Design and Food.
Music	In Music, you will explore music styles and music skills development. You will develop performance, composition and music production skills and develop your knowledge and understanding of music, learning to play an instrument focusing on melodies, harmonies, rhythms using music notations whilst understanding the characteristics and features of different styles of music. You will also explore music through active listening, analysing concepts to develop your own appreciation for music.
Art	Within Art, Year7 Students study <i>Cubism</i> and learn about Picasso and his artwork. You will be taught the elements of drawing such as <i>Line and Tone</i> and you will be introduced to <i>Colour Theory</i> , learning about Primary Colours and Secondary colours. In addition to this you will be exploring the use of watercolour and acrylic paints to create your very own Cubist piece of art.
Performing Arts	Year 7 Performing Arts is a diverse and inclusive subject where all students can learn to be creative, confident and skilled performers. We offer a variety of topics both practically and theoretically to enhance students' knowledge and understanding of the different skills in dance, drama and vocal. Within performing arts, students get an opportunity to take a leap out of their comfort zone and gain an in depth understanding of how to be imaginative and communicate with peers in a unique and fun way.
RE	In Year 7 RE you will study two of philosophy's ultimate questions: Where did we come from? How do we know right from wrong? By exploring a variety of religious stories, scientific explanations, atheistic and modern philosophers you will explore your own values and interpretations of the world around you and your place within it.









Our Bridge PRSHE Curriculum

From the moment that pupils begin their journey in the Bridge at President Kennedy, they will be exposed to our 'Three Strands' PRSHE (personal, relationships, social, health and economic) curriculum, which enables students to become successful, happy, and well-rounded young adults who are ready to thrive in the wider world. The aim of our curriculum is to instil students with the skills and characteristics needed to make confident and informed decisions about their health, mental wellbeing, and relationships. The PKS 'Three Strands' curriculum is centred around three principal threads: Living in the Wider World, Keeping Safe and Healthy and Student Leadership and Service. At President Kennedy, our PRSHE is primarily delivered during morning tutor times, led by the student's tutor, who takes a principal role in pastorally supporting their tutees through positive relationships, as well as being part of class discussions in students' main curriculum subjects. In our curriculum, we have ensured that there are opportunities for verbal discussions and for pupils to consider applicable real-life scenarios so that they can reflect upon and apply the knowledge that they have gained.

Through our PRSHE curriculum, which aligns with the recent Government Statutory Guidance, we aspire to support our pupils to develop resilience, emotional awareness and to know when and how to ask for

help, as well as know where they can access support.

Students are encouraged to think deeply about what makes an effective 'leader', using fictional and non-fictional texts as well as examples of real people from the wider world - both past and present.

Students are also given opportunities to undertake leadership roles of their own within the Bridge: becoming Student Council members who voice student concerns, organising their own enrichment clubs and managing fundraising activities for local charities of their choice.

Students are challenged to consider thought-provoking topics which will prepare them for life beyond their school years. Through celebrations of National events such as **Holocaust Memorial** Day, World Book Day, International Women's Day along with various religious days, students are taught about the importance of community values and mutual respect.

As well as this, our **University Visit** programme will give all students the chance to visit a university during their time in the Bridge with a view to broadening student's horizons.

Students are stimulated to contemplate a range of factors that affect their physical and emotional wellbeing so they can make informed choices about their own lifestyle and relationships by recognising what is healthy and what isn't. Exploration of emotions is also explored so students understand themselves, and empathise with others.

Furthermore, students will explore how to manage strong emotions such as anger and stress; the impact of spending time online and on social media; the importance of healthy lifestyles; the consequences of using drugs; and how to identify and possess healthy and non-toxic relationships.

Making the Grade ... At GCSE and A Level



Another set of outstanding GCSE results in 2025

The vast majority of our Year 11 students will progress to President Kennedy School's Post 16 to study a vast range of academic and vocational courses. Last year, the school again achieved excellent examination results at A Level and GCSE, either well above the city and national averages or inline. In 2025, President Kennedy School's GCSE results remained very strong with 60% of our students achieving the important measure of Grade 4 - 9 in both English and Maths.

At A-Level, across all subjects, 24% of our students achieved the very top grade of A*/A and 80% of our students achieved a Distinction* or Distinction. The average grade achieved by students studying vocational courses was a Distinction which is an outstanding achievement. 100% of our Post-16 students went onto positive first choice destinations with 88% progressing to a Level 4 + course and 43% going off to the top-ranking universities.

In Year 13, this year 88% of our students achieved their first-choice university or apprenticeship, with 43% of our students achieving a place on the top 15 ranking universities for their course.

We are fully committed to improving the life chances of all our students and we are incredibly proud of our 'no barriers' approach which allows our students to flourish academically.

Targeted careers events and guidance is offered to all students in every year group.












D-Day Remembered with Holocaust Survivor

On 6th June Peter Lantos visited President Kennedy School. Peter is a Holocaust survivor of Bergen-Belsen Concentration Camp.

President Kennedy School has been fortunate enough to receive regular visits from Peter. On this visit, marked by the historical significance of the D-Day, Peter met with several students from Years 8, 9, 10, and 12. He spent the morning unveiling the new signs in the Holocaust memorial garden and speaking to students about what happened to him during the Holocaust.

Some of our Year 8 students then read poems written for Peter to mark the importance of remembrance. Year 10 students then visited the garden and asked Peter some moving questions. Peter spent the next part of the day working with students involved in an 'Echo Eternal' performance last year. The performance was an artistic retelling of Peter's testimony through shadow work and puppeteering.

The students showed Peter their film and then presented him with their experiences of working on the project.

For the final part of the day, Peter met with some students for a discussion on his books. Year 8 students asked Peter about his book 'The Boy Who Didn't Want to Die' and Year 12 students asked him about 'Parallel Lines.'

The questions students asked were deeply thought-provoking and they learned a lot about the importance of peace and reconciliation from Peter's responses.

Students gifted Peter a book of the poems and speeches they had read through on the day as a thank you for all of the time he has devoted to President Kennedy School.

It was a fantastic day for everyone involved, and we look forward to welcoming Peter back in July when he speaks at our Post-16 Ethics Conference.


If parents have more than one child, they can access Class Charts information about their children from a single, centralised parent account.
