








Year 11 English Masterclass

This week the Library's recommended reads are...



Stitched Up by Steve Cole

The horrific real-life cost of fast fashion is exposed in this gripping tale of survival.

When twelve-year-old Hanh is offered a job as a shop assistant in Hanoi, she sees it as a chance to earn money to send back to her family living in poverty in rural Vietnam. Life in this sweatshop is a daily hell of long hours, little rest, poor food and regular violence. Hanh is desperate to escape, but when an opportunity arises will she be able to find the courage to take a dangerous chance?



The Battle of Cable Street by Tanya Landman

Life has always been tough on the streets of Stepney, where Elsie and her brother Mikey are growing up in a vermin-infested slum nicknamed "Paradise". But the rise of anti-Semitic fascist Oswald Mosley and his Blackshirts in the 1930s stirs up trouble between families who have lived closely together for years, and Elsie sees friendships torn apart. When Elsie and Mikey attend a Mosley rally, intending to heckle and cause trouble, they soon see how dangerous the situation has become, but out in the streets the fascists find that people will stand and fight against them and against hatred in what becomes the dramatic Battle of Cable Street.

Tips on Social Media...

Tik Tok

What should parents be concerned about?

- When you download the app, users can see all the content without creating an account although they are not able to
 post, like or share anything until they've set up an account on the app.
- By default, all accounts are public so anyone on the app can see what your child shares. However, only approved followers can send them messages.
- Users can like or react to a video, follow an account or send messages to each other, so there is the risk that strangers
 will be able to directly contact children on the app.
- Children may be tempted to take risks to get more of a following or likes on a video so it's important to talk about what they share and with who.
- Need to delete your account? Go to Me>Tap ..., located on the top right corner>Tap Manage account > Delete account. Follow the instructions in the app to delete your account.

Does TikTok have any e-safety features?

Digital Wellbeing

Like Facebook and Instagram, it has a digital wellbeing element (which is password protected) that alerts users who have been on the app for more than two hours. You can also turn on 'restricted mode' to filter out inappropriate content on the app.

Private account

You can set an account to be private so that all videos can only be seen by the creator and no one else on the platform. With a private account, you can approve or deny users and limit incoming messages to followers only.

Please note that even with a private account, your child's profile photo, username, and bio are still visible to all users on the platform. You can manage who can comment, duet and direct message your child on the app.

Privacy settings

TikTok users under 18 will have their accounts set to private-by-default, which means only someone who the user approves as a follower can view their videos. The change is part of a wider package of measures designed to drive higher standards of user privacy and safety. Download the updated privacy settings here.

Internet Matters CEO Carolyn Bunting says: "The safety of children and young people online needs to be a priority for organisations across the industry.

The disabling of direct messaging on the TikTok platform for under 16s is a significant move in prioritising the safety of their young users and we are pleased to see the protection of their younger users taking precedence in their product changes.

TikTok provides fantastic opportunities to be creative and have fun, especially in these unprecedented times and it is encouraging to see them invest in a number of initiatives that help to create a safer environment for young people."

Cost of living - mobile connectivity

Parents struggling to afford mobile data are being encouraged to access free data support through the National Databank.

Free sim cards pre-loaded with up to 6 months of data can be gifted to any adult over the age of 18 who needs help staying connected to the internet.

National Databank distribution points include: Customer Services Centre at Broadgate House, any of the 8 community family hubs, Moat House Community Trust, Central Library and community libraries at Stoke, Tile Hill, Bell Green and Foleshill.
