Ramadan is the holy month in the Islamic calendar. During Ramadan, Muslims fast. Some people think that we don't even eat for the whole month. However, this is not true.

We start with the morning meal which is called *Suhoor*. This meal starts right before the morning prayer *Fajar*. We open up our fast when the 4th prayer starts *Maghrib* which happens at sunset.

If you're fasting and you eat unknowingly you can continue to fast but if you do eat knowingly then you must make up that fast after Ramadan.

During the day, we pray and read the holy book in Islam which is the *Quran*.

During the month we believe that the gates of Jahannam (Hell) close and the gates of Jannah (Heaven) open. We also believe that the devil has been locked up.

Non-Muslims can also take part. We also pray a special prayer called Tarawih.

The project brief was to create a concept to support Coventry University with a variety of needs. They had to brand it, budget it and state what the benefits would be for their chosen student persona.


Miss Brogdan worked hard with the students, supporting each project as they were presenting at Coventry University on Wednesday evening. Each group did a presentation to a panel

of academics in a meeting room. They were very nervous, and it certainly pushed them out of their comfort zone. However, they did enjoy the experience after it was over.



This week the Library's recommended reads are...






Grandpa Frank's Great Big Bucket List by Jenny Pearson
