Disabled Parking Bays - Important Information from the Headteacher

Dear Parents and Carers,

We have 4 disabled parking bays at the front of the school. These are for blue badge holders only.

If you are a blue badge holder, a parking permit card can be requested from our School Reception or by emailing the school at: info@pks.coventry.sch.uk.

If any other parents and carers have a genuine need to drive onto the school site in order to drop off or collect a student, such as having students with temporary or permanent mobility issues, the school are now also issuing temporary parking permit cards for drivers who are eligible to come on site with prior agreement from their child's College Team or a member of the School Leadership Team.

These can also be obtained from School Reception or by emailing the school at:

These will then need to be collected and displayed in the cars of eligible parents/carers on arrival or when requested by a member of school staff on the gate.

Parents are discouraged from driving onto the school site in order to safeguard and protect our students and staff when they are coming into school and also leaving the school building.

Reception staff will also issue parking permit cards to staff and visitors who are eligible.

Year 7 and Year 8 Play First Cricket Game!


The Year 7 and Year 8 cricket teams played their first ever games for President Kennedy School last week, both teams have only been training since Easter.
