#### **Year 9 Students Help the Homeless**

LangarAid

As part of enrichment week, we took a group of Year 9 students to Langar Aid House in Coventry to make food parcels for those in our community who need it most.


Langar Aid is a humanitarian charity who have been awarded the Queens Award for Voluntary Service. They run a large outreach programme in the UK, feeding the most vulnerable people of our society under the larger national organisation Khalsa Aid.

They provide hot, nutritious meals to the homeless, isolated and vulnerable as well as dropping off meals to many hostels and schools around Coventry and across the West Midlands on a daily basis. They also deliver food parcels and hot meals to many students and their families who attend President Kennedy as well as other Futures Trust schools.

During lockdown, the demand for food parcels had drastically increased for many families and individuals who have struggled financially. Langar Aid became the main distributor for food across the city which is supported by donations from a variety of stores and outlets.

Langar Aid has a dedicated team of volunteers who support and help out every day. A group of our students volunteered their time to support with the packing of food parcels during enrichment week. This involved the students leaving school at 9.30am during the summer holiday and were transported to and from LA house via the school mini bus

The food parcels included essential food items such as bread, milk and vegetables which were loaded into vans for drivers to deliver to schools and families in need across Coventry.



#### **Disabled Parking Bays**

We have 4 disabled parking bays at the front of the school. These are for blue badge holders only.

If you are a blue badge holder, a parking permit card can be requested from our School Reception or by emailing the school at info@pks.coventry.sch.uk.

If any other parents and carers have a genuine need to drive onto the school site in order to drop off or collect a student, such as having students with temporary or permanent mobility issues, the school are now also issuing temporary parking permit cards for drivers who are eligible to come on site with prior agreement from their child's College Team or a member of the School Leadership Team. These can also be obtained from School Reception or by emailing the school at <a href="mailto:info@pks.coventry.sch.uk">info@pks.coventry.sch.uk</a>. These will then need to be collected and displayed in the cars of eligible parents/carers on arrival or when requested by a member of school staff on the gate.

Parents are discouraged from driving onto the school site in order to safeguard and protect our students and staff when they are coming into school and also leaving the school building.

Reception staff will also issue parking permit cards to staff and visitors who are eligible.


