
How to Revise in Geography





1.	Flash cards. Use your books/revision guides/case study to create flash cards on key facts and key
	words. Make sure it has a question/prompt on one side and the answer on the back. Once you
	have made them use them to test yourself or get someone else to test you.
2.	Mind mapping. Complete a mind-map on a certain topic, writing down as much as you can from memory. Once you have done as much as you can, use your book/revision guide to add to your mind-map in a different colour.
3.	Retrieval quizzes. Design your own retrieval quiz using your book/revision guide. Wait at least
	three days before answering the questions and mark them using your notes.
4.	Diagrams. Draw a series of pictures or annotated diagrams from memory to help explain how a
	process or something is formed, e.g. a waterfall. Then check your notes to see how to improve.
5.	Exam questions. Try practice exam questions from memory. Use the mark scheme to mark your
	answer and to see how you could improve.
6.	Case study factfiles. Create case study factfiles with the key facts and figures. Then use these to
	test yourself.
7.	Study group. Get together with a friend and test each other on key facts/words.
8.	GCSEpod. Watch the GCSEpod videos and then use them to make flashcards and retrieval quizzes
	to test yourself.
