Students were given a talk about helicopters, how they work and how the Navy use them. They were then given a template of a paper helicopter from which they were asked to create their own design. The aim was to keep the helicopters in the air for as long as possible.

Once the designs were complete, students competed against each other to see whose helicopter design could stay in the air the longest.

Year 7 did a fantastic job and the designs were well thought out.

The Navy personnel were very impressed with the quality of the designs and the construction from our Year 7 cohort and said they were some of the best they had seen!

Students followed Santa's sleigh through the local community collecting money for Myton Hospice and the Air Ambulance.


It was a magical evening filled with Christmas spirit and so nice to spend time out in the local community. They raised £720.88!! Well done all involved!

This week the Library's recommended reads are...




The Final Year by Matt Goodfellow

When they are put in two different classes and PS finds a new friend in Turner, the school bully, Nate's world turns upside-down. As he struggles to make sense of this and forge new friendships, he's dealt another blow when his youngest brother, Dylan is rushed into hospital.

His new teacher, Mr Joshua, sees a spark inside of Nate that's lit by his love of reading and writing and shows him how to use this to process what's going on. But with so much working against him, and anger rising inside him, will this be enough? A powerful and lyrical story about finding your place in the world and the people that matter within it.
