Students Attend FA Cup Final at Wembley

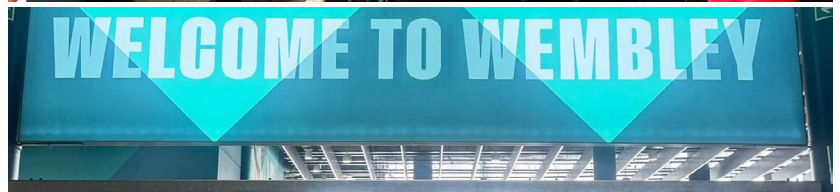

Students Meet Award Winning Author Sufiya



This week some of our Year 7 and Year 9 students were invited to meet award winning author Sufiya Ahmed as part of the National Year of Reading celebrations.

During the event Sufiya, talked about her latest book "Under Fire" which is about a boy from Coventry who is evacuated to India during the Second World War to escape the Blitz, and how he reconnects with his Indian heritage.

We also found out, Sufiya spent many years working in Westminster writing speeches for government officials and politicians such as former Prime Minister Gordon Brown before she became a children's writer.

Her fascination with First and Second World War history inspired most of her novels, and she invited some of the students on to the stage to dress up as Suffragette's and spies.

At the end of the session the students were able to buy some of her books and get them signed.

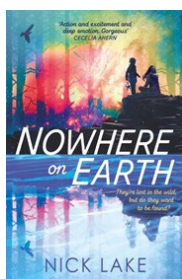


Murder at the Museum by Alasdair Beckett-King

Sixteen-year-old Emily and her little brother Aidan are onboard a plane bound for Anchorage. When the plane crashes, both kids and the pilot barely escape with their lives and are left to fight for survival in the Alaskan wilderness. But there is worse to come - Emily and Aidan are being chased, and their shady, unknown pursuers are closing in.

As the kids go on the run, Emily finds herself in greater danger than she could have imagined. Because nothing in her life is what it seems - not even the things she holds dearest of all...
