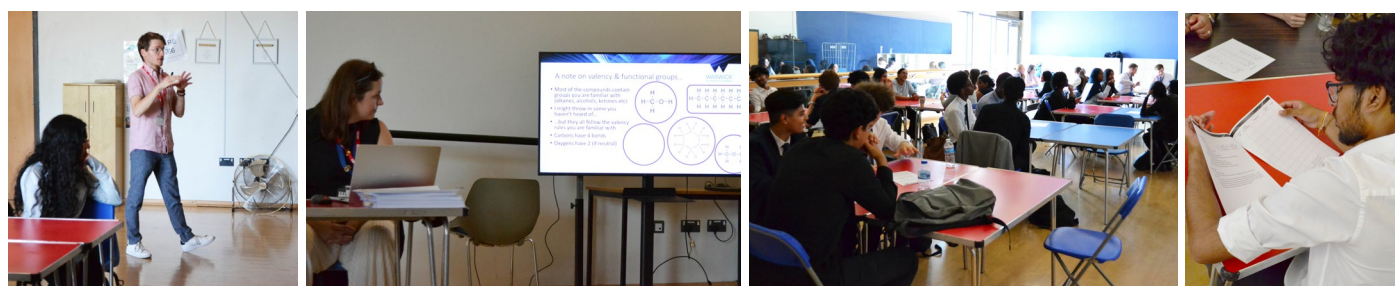
Analytical Monopoly Challenge

On Tuesday 7th July our Year 12 chemistry students were given the opportunity to take part in the Warwick University "Analytical Monopoly Challenge". This is an activity initially set up to test the analytical skills of their 2nd year university students, but had been adjusted to meet the needs of Year 12 students. This activity consisted of our students working in teams of 4 to make as much money as possible by analysing and correctly identifying different chemical compounds using a range of different analytical techniques.

This tested our students problem-solving, teamwork skills and chemistry knowledge to their absolute limit further deepening their knowledge of the subject ready for Y13.
