President Kennedy School have celebrated another year of fantastic A level and BTEC results. Well done to all of our students - we are so proud of the hard work and dedication they have demonstrated over the last two years which has resulted in some fantastic destinations.

Here are a few of our destinations we would like to share with you - but we could have easily ended up writing about everyone.

We have three students who will be studying Medicine at University. Vandana has achieved 3 A* grades in Biology, Chemistry and Psychology to secure a highly competitive place studying Medicine at the University of Nottingham. Haroun will study Medicine at the University of Birmingham, and Inaya will study Medicine at the University of Leicester.

Youssef and Ellis have each achieved an amazing 3 A* grades in Physics, Maths and Further Maths to secure places studying Engineering at Warwick and Sheffield universities respectively.
