Following the success of our students in this year's annual essay writing competition for the World Class Schools' Quality Mark organisation, students had the chance to meet with Mr Clayton on the 2nd of December. This was in recognition of their fantastic achievements over the last few months, their commitment and their determination to succeed, beyond their experiences in the classroom. Students were presented with certificates that honoured their pride, involvement and excellence, and were commended for the fantastic work they have been doing.

Students' essay writing journeys started in July when they were presented with the thought-provoking essay question for 2021: 'How much can motivation from parents, or the important adults in your life, help or hinder your success?'. With a disruptive year caused by the pandemic, this focus was especially reflective of the extra time we have had to spend at home with our parents and carers. This specific question prompted students to reflect on their own experiences of motivation in a range of ways.

The role of important adults in the lives of children, like parents and teachers, is a prominent theme in the books of children's author Dan Freedman, who decided on this year's essay question. His most recent novel, **Unstoppable**, focuses on the relationship of a father with his twins, and explores the impact he has on their success. This inspiration for the question will surely guide Dan in choosing his winning essay from the many that were submitted from a multitude of World Class Schools across the country.

President Kennedy School will find out if we have been triumphant once more at the annual World Class Schools' ceremony, with essays from both Arya (Year 9) and Abshara (Year 8) shortlisted for this year's final award. This celebratory evening will be a way to acknowledge the incredible time and effort that students have put in to their essays.

A group of ten Year 7 students were lucky enough to be part of an audience at Warwick University to listen to the inspirational story of Nick Buttler, who ran a marathon in every country of the world. This was the first time that the university was able to invite students from secondary school back onto their campus since December 2019.

Students listened to Nick's inspirational story from being an under achieving child who struggled to walk, to becoming an ultra-runner and setting himself the challenge to run in every country in the world.

During his adventure, he had to run in war torn countries and told us that he had to wear two watches to record every marathon so that it could be recognised in the Guinness World Records.

Students were able to ask Nick questions about his life and the drastic change of lifestyle when the epidemic hit. Luckily, his record attempt finished before Covid-19 spread across the world.




Phillip Pullman Speaks with President Kennedy School Students!
