Passing for White by Tanya Landman

Inspired by the amazing true story of Ellen Craft who escaped a life of slavery through a daring disguise and won freedom for herself and her husband.

It's 1848 in the Deep South of America. Rosa is a slave but her owner is also her father and her fair skin means she can 'pass for white'. With the help of her husband Benjamin, she disguises herself as a young southern gentleman and Benjamin's master. In this guise, the couple flee the South, explaining away their lack of literacy, avoiding those they have encountered before and holding their nerve over a thousand miles to freedom.



With the Fire on High by Elizabeth Acevedo

Emoni wants to be a chef more than anything, but having a two-year-old daughter, and being seventeen and still at school, isn't exactly making life easy. The one place she can let everything go is in the kitchen, where she has magical hands - whipping up extraordinary food beloved by everyone from her grandmother to her best friend Angelica. Bronze Duke of Edinburgh's Award Expedition

On Saturday 8th October, 21 Year 10 students embarked on their Bronze DofE expedition. This was the first time the group had been out since beginning to train for their expedition back in Year 9.

This expedition took 4 groups around the local area of Kenilworth and Warwick over 2 days with an overnight camp in between.

Day one saw the groups test out their map reading skills across the countryside, checking for way-markers and thinking about the distance between certain points. Groups learned to retrace their steps if they found themselves unsure of their location, took in some stunning scenery, and by 5.30pm all groups had found their way to the campsite in Hatton.

Having never done so before, the students put up their tents under the watchful eye of our experienced staff helpers, before getting to grips with cooking dinner on the Trangia camping stoves. After a cold, and in some cases, slightly damp night, the groups packed away all of their kit to carry with them again for day two. This route took them along the canal towpath for some distance where students learned a little history of the canal and saw how locks worked to transport boats up and down hills. Though slightly more tired than the day before, students did well to navigate themselves independently to the finish point and after a positive debrief and some excitement about getting out again soon, they headed back to school, and home for a rest!

Huge thank you to Miss Kirkham for organising the expedition and the supporting staff, including a VIP appearance from Mr Clayton, for all of their expertise and commitment to the students as they undertook this challenge.

Congestion Concerns

As you will be aware, the school has only a single entrance / exit on Rookery Lane. This does mean that Rookery Lane and Gospel Oak Road regularly become very congested between 3pm and 3.15pm as many parents arrive in cars to collect students from school.

Local residents have raised with me that on many occasions recently this has resulted in driveways being blocked and/or damage occurring to their vehicles as parent cars temporarily park on roads/pavements waiting to collect students. With only one entrance we are unable to operate a system where parents come into the car park to collect students. Traffic congestion also leads to a very crowded and potentially dangerous end to the school day which requires considerable supervision from school staff. We will, of course, continue to do this so that we can ensure students remain safe while leaving school. That said, this would be a lot easier to do if the parked traffic was significantly reduced.

Could I respectfully request that you only park close to the school to pick up your child if it is absolutely necessary or if you are collecting students with a disability so that we can continue to enjoy a respectful and productive relationship with our neighbours.
