RSE CHANGES:

In the last year, with the government making Relationship and Sex Education a Statutory requirement in all schools last September, it has provided us with a perfect opportunity to revisit our RSE and PSHRE curriculum and ensure we are delivering transformational education.

In recent years, there has been changes in terminology and emphasis, with explicit reference to family relationships, parenting, sexual and gender identity, consent, media, sexual harassment, healthy vs unhealthy relationships and the law.

Our aim here is to equip all pupils with the knowledge to make wise and informed choices, alongside developing life skills, respectful attitudes towards others and inclusive values.
